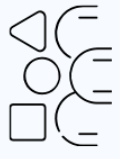
HBVA's work over the next five years focuses on three interconnected priorities designed to strengthen the organisation, empower communities, and influence national systems.

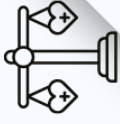
